



# 2021 Summer CyberCamps

## Student Code of Conduct, Use of Technology & Release of Liability Agreement

BACCC 2021 Summer CyberCamps are taught by a single trainer and up to two mentors. In order to provide a positive and meaningful experience and a safe environment for all campers, we require that all campers maintain self-discipline. Campers must be able to follow instruction given by one instructor/trainer in an online classroom environment, must be able to manage their own behavior in an online group setting, and work independently.

Campers are expected to follow this Code of Conduct at all times. If behavioral problems persist, parents will be contacted to discuss the situation. Disruptive behavior will result in students being withdrawn from camp.

- Campers are expected to show courtesy and respect for their fellow campers and for CyberCamp personnel.
- Campers shall not take part in or facilitate discrimination of any kind, including, but not limited to discrimination based on gender, race, national origin, ethnicity, age, religion, sexual orientation, disability, handicap, or intelligence.
- Campers are expected to follow the instructions of camp trainers, mentors, and staff.
- Campers shall not engage in any form of harassment or bullying. Harassment consist of conduct of any type (including, but not limited to written, verbal, or graphic conduct) which has the purpose or effect of interfering with another campers' work or which creates an intimidating, hostile, or offensive learning environment.
- Campers shall uphold high standards of integrity through honesty, trust, fairness, and responsibility. Campers are expected to demonstrate a spirit of cooperation and exploration within the guidelines provided by their trainers and mentors, to meet the intellectual challenges of the CyberCamps through honest effort and hard work.

Campers are expected to use CyberCamp technology safely and responsibly. Campers are prohibited from using CyberCamp technology for improper purposes including, but not limited to:

- Accessing, posting, displaying, or otherwise using material that is discriminatory, libelous, defamatory, obscene, sexually explicit, or disruptive.
- Bully, harass, intimidate, or threaten other campers or CyberCamp personell.
- Disclose, use, or disseminate personal identification information (such as name, address, telephone number, SS#, or other personal information) of another camper or CyberCyber personnel.
- Infringe on copyright, license, trademark, patent, or other intellectual property rights.
- Intentionally disrupt or harm CyberCamp technology or other CyberCamp operations.
- Install unauthorized software.
